- ♥ Are there people who would like to visit and say goodbye?
- ♥ Some family members may wish to be present for euthanasia, while others may prefer not to be.
- ♥ Care of the body may be burial, or cremation with the option of having the ashes returned to you.
- ♥ You may be comforted by keepsakes such as tags, a lock of hair, or a paw print.
